You will be required to email or fax a signed written request to make a change or to receive a refund for any workshop registration within three business days before the scheduled class.

TRAINING CERTIFICATES: Participants for whom the Council has received and processed registration and payment prior to a workshop will receive their training certificate at the conclusion of the training. All other participants will be mailed their training certificate after payment and \$5 late fee is received and processed.

EIP: Proof of having applied for EIP is NOT considered payment. Only an EIP award certificate is accepted as payment. If you have applied for EIP but not received the award certificate, you will have to pay by check, money order or credit card prior to the start of the workshop.

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

Family child care providers, school age program staff and center staff must have at least thirty (30) hours of training every 2 years. Fifteen (15) hours of such training must be completed during the first six months of a program's licensure or registration, or employment by any staff member. Training must cover all nine categories listed below. Use this list to help ensure that you meet your training requirements. Each course in the Workshop Description states the training category it fulfills.

- 1. Principles of childhood development, including the appropriate supervision of children, meeting the needs of children enrolled in the program with physical or emotional challenges, and behavior management and discipline.
- 2. Nutrition and health needs of children.
- 3. Child care program development.
- 4. Safety and security procedures, including communication between parents and staff.
- 5. Business record maintenance and management.
- 6. Child abuse and maltreatment identification and prevention.
- 7. Statutes and regulations pertaining to child care.
- 8. Statutes and regulations pertaining to child abuse and maltreatment.
- 9. Education and prevention of Shaken Baby Syndrome. (Not required for School Age program staff).

EIP TUITION SUPPORT FOR TRAINING

The Educational Incentive Program (EIP) was created to promote the professional and career development of those working in the field of child care. Scholarships are awarded based on financial need, and can be used for Council workshops and conferences, credit-bearing courses, and credentials within the child care profession. Please call 1-800-295-9616 or visit www.ecetp.pdp.albany.edu/ for an application and further information. Remember to apply early for EIP. The steps to receive an EIP Scholarship are:

- 1. Review calendar.
- 2. Select courses.
- 3. Apply to EIP in Albany for all courses selected at least one month prior to course date.
- 4. When you receive the award certificate, sign the certificate and mail it to the Child Care Council with the registration form.
- **5. Proof of having applied for EIP is not considered payment. Only an EIP award certificate will be accepted as payment.** The award certificate must be received by the Council no later than 5 business days before the workshop. Without the award certificate, you will have to pay by check or credit card. You will be reimbursed within 5 business days after receipt of duplicate payment from EIP.
